Earn and Learn Scheme




The bar graph shows gender classifications in the Earn and Learn Scheme - 2018-19 to 2022-23

Graph: Gender wise details of Blood Donation Camp - 2018-19 to 2022-23





Graph: Gender wise details of Medical Checkup record



Gender wise details of Medical Checkup - Arts Faculty 2018-19 to 2022-23




Science Faculty- Medical Checkup




Gender wise details of Medical Checkup -Science Faculty 2018-19 to 2022-23



Craph: Year wise Gender Classification




The bar graph shows gender classifications of enrolled candidates in the college - 2018-19 to 2022-23


Graph - Gender Difference in Various Social Categories: 2018-19


Graph - Gender Difference in Various Social Categories: 2019-20


Graph - Gender Difference in Various Social Categories: 2020-21


Graph - Gender Difference in Various Social Categories: 2021-22

Graph - Gender Difference in Various Social Categories: 2022-23




The bar graph shows gender classifications of faculty wise analysis of students – 2018-19


The bar graph shows gender classifications of faculty wise analysis of students – 2019-20


The bar graph shows gender classifications of faculty wise analysis of students - 2020-21


The bar graph shows gender classifications of faculty wise analysis of students – 2021-22


The bar graph shows gender classifications of faculty wise analysis of students - 2022-23








After observing presentation, documents and discussion with faculty it has been observed that the college has good no. of facilities, activities and tried maintain to gender balance.

The committee has some Recommendations as follow

- 1. In the average participation of girls in various sports competitions is low at 40.89 percent. Special measures should be taken to increase the participation of girls in sports competitions.
- 2. Due to low levels of hemoglobin the participation of girls in blood donation camps is very low. Special measures should be taken to increase the overall hemoglobin level of girls.
- 3. Although the average enrollment of girls is 36.33 percent, which is very low, it is expected to increase.

According to a gender audit conducted by K. K. 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
