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1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

K.K.Wagh Education Society is a leading group of educational institutes in North Maharashtra of India. It is a reputed and recognized society known for providing quality education to students mostly coming from economically weaker section of the society. It was founded by the visionary leader Late Padmashree Karmaveer Kakasaheb Wagh in 1970 with the main objective to impart education to the rural students.

With the vision "**To empower rural students for success in the competitive world through quality education.**", K. K. Wagh Education Society established Arts, Commerce, Science and Computer Science College, at Kakasaheb Nagar in 2004-05. The College has been established with a mission "**To groom students to be self-dependent and responsible citizens through value based and skill-based education.**" The college is located in the rural area of Niphad tehsil of Nashik district (Maharashtra). The main motto of the college is to provide quality education to students at affordable cost, especially the girl students, who are deprived from higher education due to non-availability of colleges at their native place. The college has a beautiful campus, spacious buildings with well-equipped infrastructure, and ample playground for the overall development of students. The college offers quality higher education in Arts, Commerce, Science, and Computer Science subjects at the undergraduate level. Through curricular and extracurricular activities, the college develops life skills and core competencies among the students. The use of ICT tools by teachers for teaching and learning encourages students to enhance their ICT literacy. In order to inculcate ethics and moral values among students, extension activities by NSS and SDO, are organized. Such activities help the students for their all-round development and upliftment.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

The K. K. Wagh Education Society's K. K. Wagh Arts, Commerce, Science & Computer Science College, Kakasaheb Nagar, is affiliated to Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune. The college adheres to the curricula prescribed by the university for undergraduate students and offers eight academic programs with duration of three years at the undergraduate level. The college meticulously plans and implements its academic sessions in accordance with university guidelines. This involves the preparation of academic calendars and departmental meetings. A master timetable, faculty-wise timetable, and individual timetable etc. are prepared to facilitate smooth academic operations, including the allocation of courses, continuous internal assessment, and the use of ICT tools for teaching and learning. The syllabus is distributed among the faculty, and then they prepare their teaching plans at the beginning of each semester.

The university has established a method for internal evaluation, encompassing internal examinations, projects, exercises, oral assessments, etc., for all programs. The faculty actively participates in various activities, such as workshops on curriculum designing, question paper setting, and Central Assessment Programmes. Guest lectures on current trends in respective subjects are organized for students. Feedback analysis is conducted, and important points are discussed in departmental meetings. If necessary, instructions are given to teachers for

improvements, fostering a student-centric approach. The feedback system in the college aids the management and faculty for understanding the effectiveness of teaching methodologies in curriculum implementation.

Taking a practical approach to learning, the college arranges field visits and study tours through different departments. Activities related to human values, environmental protection, and gender equality are regularly conducted through NSS and SDO. From the last five years, the college has offered various certificate courses to students. Library facilities are provided, to the student according to their requirement and record of the same is maintained through online software. Reference books, question banks, and competitive exam materials are made available for the students. Access to national journals is facilitated through online platforms such as INFLIBNET, offering E-resources like N-list, e-Shodhsindhu, NDLI Club, and e-Pathshala library to update the knowledge of both students and faculty members.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

K. K. Wagh Arts, Commerce, Science & Computer Science College is situated in rural area of Nashik district. The intake capacity of the college is 440 students. The institution has transparent admission process in which admissions are given as per the reservation policy of the Government of Maharashtra and as per rules of Savitribai Phule Pune University. Student-centric teaching-learning methods and tools such as field projects, survey method, ICT enabled classrooms etc. are incorporated for enhancing teaching-learning processes. Teachers assess the learning levels of the students through their performance in classroom presentation, discussion, test, assignments, internal examination etc. The college arranges field visits, industrial visits to provide students an exposure about the practical working environment. The college library maintains enriched collection of reference and text books, journals, magazines and e-resources. Teachers use ICT based teaching-learning process through power point presentations, YouTube videos, Google classroom, Zoom app etc. The co-curricular and extracurricular activities are organized to boost students for positive thinking, creating social awareness among the students. An effective mentor-mentee system for better counseling is adopted by the college. Programmes and Course outcomes are outlined by SPPU in subject curricula. The same are designed to facilitate the students with knowledge, life skills, moral values, and self-confidence.

The evaluation process is followed as per SPPU guidelines. Central Assessment Programs (CAP) is conducted. It is monitored by the Principal, College Examination Officer (CEO) and Heads of the Department. The Examination Committee takes efforts for smooth conduction of examination. The internal examinations marks are displayed on student's notice board. Department wise result analysis is prepared after declaration of result, if required suggestions are given to concern teachers for improvement in result. The faculties are devoted, committed and well experienced. Some faculties are highly qualified NET/SET exam as well as Ph.D. Degree holders. A regular assessment of teaching faculty is done through performance appraisal system and student feedback analysis, if required action is taken for maintaining academic performance. Through effective Mentoring system the college solve the academic and non-academic problems of students.

Research, Innovations and Extension

The college has Research Committee which guides the faculty members for initiating research activities. The college promotes a healthy research environment in the college. The Research Committee of the college facilitates and guides faculty and students for publication of research papers. One faculty member has completed M. Phil and five faculties have been awarded Ph.D. degree. The college conducted various seminars on Intellectual Property Rights (IPR), training programs like soft skill development for the students. The faculty

members have published 3 books, 34 research papers of which 26 are in the UGC listed journals and 08 research papers in conference proceedings.

There is an active & functional NSS unit in the college. Every year 150 students are participated in NSS. The main objectives of NSS are to understand the needs and problems of the Society, and solve the problems through NSS activities. Seven days special residential NSS camp is organized by college in adopted village. Various Social, National and Community based activities including Blood Donation Camp, Blood Group Check-up camp, Tree Plantation, Health survey; *Gram Swachhata Abhiyan*, etc are organized during these seven days. A total of 92 different extension activities and 64 Outreach programmes have been conducted during the last five years. About 21 MoUs are signed with different organizations to promote research and field activities. Awareness activities including world environment day, International Yoga Day, National voter's day are conducted. Social activities such as health camp, plastic waste collection, importance of voting, drug addiction, save girl child etc. are organized by college through NSS, SDO and Sport Department.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

The college has its premises land of 6.5730 acres with two well-equipped buildings with extension of separate toilet block, security cabin and watchman room. Total built-up area of all construction work is 4041.147 sq. mtrs. The college is located with natural surrounding and pollution-free environment. Both premises have proper lighting, seating and ventilation arrangements with generator backup. Parking facility is available for all staff members and students. The college has sufficient infrastructure with 16 class rooms for all branches, ICT enabled classrooms, Seminar hall, Meeting Hall, well-equipped Science Laboratories, Computer Laboratories, and other support facilities. The college is focus on updating of IT facilities. The present computer ratio is 1:7. The college has separate sport room and Green Gym, Spacious playground with area of 10,640 sq. mtr. The indoor and outdoor sport facilities are also available in the college. The college encourages students to participate Intercollegiate, Inter-zonal and University level Sports Tournaments. The college has library with fully automation by using Koha software. About 6217 reference and text books are available in the library. There are 16 magazines of all disciplines and subjects. The e-learning resources like N-LIST facility, e-journals and e-books are available in the library. There is separate reading room facility for boys and girls with seating capacity of 50 students and internet computer facility. The facility of WEB-OPAC system is available in the library for prompt services. The annual budget provision is made for infrastructure, library and other learning resources on the basis of recommendations of relevant committees. There is a separate provision in the budget for annual maintenance of infrastructure facilities. AMCs are made with outside agencies for maintenance of hardware, software and other infrastructure. The college uses ERP software for Online Admission, and other administrative work. The college has a biometric attendance for staff. The college is under CCTV surveillance. The purified drinking water facility is available in both buildings of college. Licensed copies of antivirus are used for all computer systems. The college has 3 UPS for uninterrupted power supply with each is of 7.5 KVA Capacity. The college has 19 fire extinguishers and a fire fighting system. The college has well-established system for maintaining physical, academic and support facilities. The society has its own workshop for repairing and maintenance. Outside agencies are also appointed for repairing and maintenance. The college has extensive infrastructure required for sports activities like athletics, volleyball, badminton, yoga, table tennis, weight lifting, power lifting, wrestling, etc. For girls, a separate common room facility is available in the campus. The girls' common room is equipped with a First Aid Box. Sanitary Napkin Vending and disposal machine is available in girls' wash room.

Student Support and Progression

The college has developed supportive system for helping the students. The college is located in rural area of Nashik district. Most of the students are from poor family and backward community. College helps these students to get Government, University Scholarship and Non-government Scholarship. Karmveer scholarship Rs. 5000 is provided to students for B.Sc. Computer Science those have not received any scholarship from central or state government. Various guest lectures are organized for students on various subjects like personality development, health and hygiene, Computing Skill, preparation of Career Guidance, competitive examination, etc. Students are encouraging for higher education. The college has various committees for guidance and safety of students like Anti-ragging Committee, prevention and protection of sexual harassment, Women Redressal Cell, Soft Skill Development, Cultural Forum etc. The college has active Training & Placement Cell which conducts training programs and expert lectures for employment opportunity to students. Under sports department students participated Zonal and University level competitions. Cultural department arranges various programmes which include cultural activities, various days, and competitions for all round development of students. The college has registered Alumni Association, in which Alumni contributed significantly in the development of the college.

Governance, Leadership and Management

K. K.Wagh education society is one of the leading educational trusts in Nashik district which is functioning from more than 53 years in Nashik district. The society is committed to provide quality and value-based education to the rural and under privileged community and students unto the last strata of the society. The mission of our college is “To groom students to be self-dependent and responsible citizens through value based and skill-based education”. The top management of the college fully support for the academic and administrative activities of the college. The academic activities and programmes are prepared by various committees of the college and approved by CDC. Important decision like sanctioning of college budget, teaching learning evaluation, starting new courses etc. are sanctioned in the CDC meeting and then approved by Management. As the academic and administrative head of the college, the Principal handles day-to-day activities regarding administration and academic with the help of HODs and supportive staff. For smooth working and conducting college activities various committees are formed in the beginning of the academic year. On the basis of annual feedback analysis then the necessary action is taken for improvement of academic performance by faculty. Assessment of teacher is done through performance appraisal system.

The Society follows the rules and regulations of SPPU and Government of Maharashtra for the recruitments of teaching and non-teaching staff. Internal audit is done by Finance Department of Society and external audit is done by CA appointed by society. Academic and administrative audit is also done by SPPU. The college follows all rules, regulations and guidelines provided by K. K. Wagh Education Society, Nashik, SPPU and Government of Maharashtra for smooth functioning and administration of college.

Institutional Values and Best Practices

The college is very sensitive and alert for safety and security of the students and staff. Efforts are taken by college to create awareness about gender equity and safety measures by providing facilities such as compound for prevention from external issues, Installation of CCTVs in college premises of both buildings. College has separate common rooms and washrooms for boys, girls and faculty. 24 hours security is provided in college premises and at the entrance gate. Various awareness programs are organized by college such as Women Empowerment, Health and Hygiene, Rights of Women, Save Girl, Save Nation, *Beti Bachao Beti Padhao* etc. First aid box is provided for students and staff. Safe drinking water and Sanitation facilities are also available in

the college.

Eco-friendly environment, green and natural surrounding campus is maintained by Tree plantation of various multiuse, medicinal and flowering plants. Efforts are taken for Carbon neutrality through tree plantation; practicing use of one-side blank pages for printing, bio-degradable waste is recycled in 'Vermicomposting Unit. College has completed green audit, energy audit and environment audit. Necessary steps are taken to save energy through the use of renewable energy resources coupled with LED bulbs and tubes that helps to minimize the power requirements. Facility of ramp and wheel chair is available for *divyangana* students. The college has celebrated birth and death anniversary of National leaders. National and International days like World Environment Day, International Yoga Day, Independence Day, Teachers Day, World AIDS Day, National Voter's Day, Republic Day, National Science Day and International Women's Day etc. are celebrated in the college in the presence of staff students and chief guest.

The college has two best practices namely *Karmaveer Chashak Kabaddi* Competition and Karmaveer Scholarship Scheme. The *Karmaveer Chashak Kabaddi* competitions jointly organized by K. K. Wagh Education Society and SMILE and SPINACH. The competition is organized every year by the society to prove the importance of sports for physical fitness and to maintain social harmony. Under Karmaveer Scholarship Scheme B.Sc. Computer Science students who are deprived of government scholarship, they are given Rs. 5000/- under this scheme who did not get any benefit of scholarship form government and University.

Under Institutional distinctiveness group insurance scheme is selected. under these scheme if student is admitted in the hospital more than 24 hours, the bill amount is reimbursed by company up to Rs. 50,000/- and in case of death of Parents , student get benefit of Rs. 5,00,000/- and in case of death of student itself parent get benefit of Rs. 1,00,000/-.

B.Sc. and B.Sc. Computer Science. In which Skill Based courses also included to enhance the skills of the students to cope up the advancing world. After the accreditation HEI is planning to introduce some new short courses on credit basis each year for students to sharpen their skills. HEI has also celebrated NEP 2020 week during 24th to 29th July 2023 as per affiliated University Circular. In which various programs were organized by all four streams like poster presentation, essay writing competition and debate and discussion on subject related to NEP 2020. On 28th July expert lecture on 'Implementation of NEP 2020' was organized for students and teachers to aware regarding the implementation of NEP 2020. HEI also motivated teachers to be present for the workshops and seminars related to NEP, because of these teachers attended 'NEP Syllabus Framing Workshop' in October 2023.</p>
2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):	<p>A virtual system known as the Academic Bank of Credit, or ABC is handle credits that students of Higher Education Institutes in India earn and that are accepted by the University Grants Commission (UGC).In the HEI, the Scheme ABC is applied to all UG courses. College raises knowledge of ABC and NEP and their significance in education. For Science & Computer Science total 140 credits are needed to finish the degree program in the stream; 132 credits are needed for normal coursework and the remaining 8 credits must be earned. Of these eight additional credits, four are allocated to Democracy and Physical Education, while the rest of the four can be obtained by a variety of means, including online courses, value-added courses, NSS camps, study tours, field visits, and industrial visits, Online Certificate Courses etc. as per UGC guidelines. Students should manually open an account with Academic Bank of Credit of India starting in Session 2021–2022, and they should create a unique student ID. Students will thus use that specific Identification Number to identify themselves. According to UGC guidelines, in order to generate an ABC ID login, all students must update their mobile number with Aadhar. Approximately 473 students have academic bank account</p>

	registrations at the college.
3. Skill development:	<p>In accordance with the rules and regulations of the affiliated university, the college offers 02 credits of coursework in Physical Education and 02 credits of coursework in Democracy, Election, and Governance to all first-year students and 02 credits of Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) for second year and third year students for each semester integrated into the university syllabus of every program. Trainers from reputed firms were invited to conduct skill development training sessions under the training and placement cell for third year students of each stream from college. Every year, our parent institute hosts a Ganpati Idol Making Workshop to help students improve their artistic and crafty abilities. The college offers opportunities for faculty members to participate in numerous seminars and skill development related events in order to improve their talents.</p>
4. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course):	<p>The four faculties of the college are Arts, Commerce, Science and Computer Science. All subjects related to Arts and Commerce, with the exception of English, Accountancy, Business Communication, are taught in Marathi. Science as well as Computer Science courses are taught entirely in English. The assessment is conducted in accordance with the course's medium. Then also according to the complexity of concepts, complex ideas and procedures both the languages (Marathi and English) is used. The college initiates and conducts all of its operations in accordance with Indian customs and culture. All guidelines, notifications, and recommendations are provided in Marathi. To promote Indian culture, numerous events are held, like Pak-kala competition, debate and elocution competitions, various days' celebration related to Indian culture (Saree day, Traditional day), Marathi Rajbhasha Din, Geography Day, Ganapati Idol Making Workshop, Essay writing competitions, Rangoli competition, Death and Birth anniversaries of freedom fighters and legends in India.</p>
5. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):	<p>The term "Outcome-Based Education" (OBE) refers to a type of education where the focus is on developing a well-defined understanding of the</p>

knowledge and skills that students should possess when they graduate from college. This approach, also known as performance-based education, aims to gauge the efficacy of education by looking at outcomes rather than inputs like amount of time spent in class. For this reason, each program's coordinator prepared program outcomes, course outcomes, and program-specific outcomes for the relevant subject teacher in accordance with the course objectives and goals already specified in the syllabus by the affiliated university. Programs, course objectives, and attainment are mapped out. The college has organized expert talks, lectures, seminars, industrial visits, and field visits in an effort to close the achievement gap between course outcomes and program outcomes at the program outcome level. Online content is also offered by colleges. As a result, students from different programs complete internships at a local business that helps in determining the results.

6. Distance education/online education:

The Savitribai Phule Pune University offers distance education for UG and PG programs to those students who have not admitted in colleges as a regular student. Due to revolution in IT sector online learning can take the place of traditional classroom instruction. Institutions are also provided different variety of offline courses to aid students in earning additional credits. Students can access various courses online by using the SWAYAM platform. During the COVID-19 Pandemic, the University used digital platforms including Zoom, Google Classroom, and Google Meet to offer online courses. The college has successfully imparted all its courses content delivery in online mode during the Pandemic (COVID-19). Faculty also used instructional YouTube channels and the WhatsApp to send various directions and notes linked to PDFs. It is possible for teachers and students to learn about modern technologies. ICT resources are available from the college for online learning. Different faculties have produced their own E-Content and YouTube channel to assist students with their academic work. Numerous web- based applications are utilized for administrative tasks, such as N- List and Koha for libraries, ERP for admissions and Tally for finance and accounting. The college conducted online examinations successfully by using guidelines of Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune. Today

Online education has broken the physical barriers creating interaction of experts and students from different area. College is ready for accepting challenges in online education for accepting NEP 2020 form the next academic year for UG Programme as per structure fixed by University.

The Institution ensures effective curriculum planning and delivery through a well-planned and documented process including Academic calendar and conduct of continuous internal Assessment

K. K. Wagh Arts, Commerce, Science and Computer Science College, Kakasaheb Nagar (Ranwad) Tal-Niphad, Dist- Nashik is affiliated to Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune (SPPU) For effective curriculum Planning and Delivery, the college strictly follows the prescribed curriculum and guidelines provided by SPPU. In the beginning of the Academic Year Principal calls upon a general meeting of faculty members to discuss planning and implementation of the curriculum.

A) Academic Calendar

The academic calendar is designed and prepared by Academic Calendar Committee as per the Academic Calendar of the University, under guidance of IQAC which is approved by the Principal. The academic calendar is circulated in the staff general meeting. Head of the departments prepare the schedule of academic and administrative of the department to support the implementation of academic calendar.

B) Time table

Time table is prepared by the time table committee of each department. Individual faculty member prepares the teaching plan for the courses assigned and regular lectures are conducted as per time table and teaching plan. On the basis of master time table the Principal and Heads of Department supervises and monitors the teaching learning process.

C) Departmental meeting

Heads of the departments in departmental meetings decide the course wise workload to the faculty. Faculty members prepare semester wise teaching plans for theory and practical courses at the beginning of the semester. The course teachers maintain the record of teaching learning process.

D) Use of ICT tools & Library Facilities

The faculty members use ICT tools for effective delivery of curriculum. Field visits are arranged for the students as a part of experiential learning. Projects, assignments, tutorials, poster presentations and field survey are carried out by the students under the supervision of subject teacher. Students interact with industry experts various fields' visits.

In the 2020-21 due to Covid -19 pandemic, online sessions were conducted by the teachers for respective subjects through Zoom platforms. Topic wise Videos are prepared for each courses and shared with the

students. The attendance record and progress details were maintained regularly by the faculty member. Head of the departments and Principal take the reviews of syllabus completion.

Students have been provided with library facilities. The library has adequate numbers of textbooks, reference books, question banks, competitive exam books. The facilities like access to National journals through online platforms INFLIBNET in which E-resources like N-list, e-Shodhsindhu, NDLI Club, e-Pathshala library are provided to students to update their knowledge.

The college organizes expert lectures of eminent persons to supplement the curriculum. The guidance is provided under Special Guidance Scheme of Savitribai Phule Pune University Pune.

Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is time- bound and efficient

Response:

- The college has developed a comprehensive mechanism for conducting internal and external assessment as per norms and guidelines provided by Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune (SPPU).
- To maintain regularity in conducting internal and external assessment as per the academic calendar the college has appointed College Examination Officer (CEO).
- The CEO prepares the schedule of examination with the help of college examination committee. It is communicated to students through notice board and announced in each classroom at the beginning of every academic year.
- The parameters of internal evaluation include attendance of students, assignments, unit tests, student seminars, orals, practicals, projects, internships.
- The internal exam question papers are prepared as per the guidelines provided of the university.
- After the internal evaluation marks are displayed on notice boards. In case of any issue, students approach the concerned teacher and the issues are resolved at department level.
- Marks of internal evaluation are submitted to CEO and then to the university.
- The internal assessment of skilled based courses like Democracy, Environmental Awareness is conducted as per the guidelines of the university.
- The university examination is conducted on a common schedule and supervised by junior supervisor, senior supervisor and CEO. The college implements mechanism of internal squad to prevent malpractices in examination.
- To maintain transparency & security in the evaluation system a separate examination room has been set up in the college & it is under 24 hours CCTV control.
- The internal assessment answer sheets are shown to the students after evaluation and the queries of students are settled promptly.
- Grievances related to the external examinations are forwarded to the University.

- These grievances are mainly related to mistakes in name, subject change, hall tickets, arrangement of special exam, add/remove subject, absenteeism result etc.
- The University declares the schedule for revaluation and demand of photocopy of corrected answer sheet after the declaration of results.
- The photocopy of answer book is provided to the student on demand as per the university procedure and concerned faculty also helps the students to verify the corrected answer sheets.
- Any change in marks after revaluation is quickly redressed and new corrected mark list is issued to the students by the University.

Response:

The College has adopted Final Year Result based analysis and Programme Exit Survey for the attainment of COs, POs for the academic year 2022-2023.

For attainment of course outcomes i.e. direct total attainment, the Internal and External marks obtained by the student at the Internal and University Examination are used. The college has decided 50% threshold value for all Courses for attainment of COs. The POs are calculated on the basis of attainment of course outcomes and Programme Exit Survey (Indirect Total Attainment) for final year students. Weightage used for Direct attainment is 70% whereas for indirect attainment is 30%.

Mechanism for COs & POs:

1. Marks Entry Classification: Under the mechanism decided by the college, the marks are classified into two Categories i.e. Internal & External (University Examination) and course wise marks entries are made.

2. Determination of Threshold Value: All marks of Internal and External examination of all students are entered in the excel sheet, then after the consideration of marks of all students for respective courses have been calculated on the basis threshold value. The threshold value is the base value upon which marks are to be considered for the further calculation of Course attainment.

3. Attainment Level Calculation of CO: On the basis of internal and external marks of students, the course attainment has been calculated and classified as those course outcomes have secure value 1 are considered as Low Course attainment, courses have secured value 2 are considered as medium Course attainment, those courses outcome have secured value 3 are considered as High Course attainment.

4. Programme Exit Survey: The College conducted a programme exit survey for attainment of PO and PSO. The programme exit surveys were filled by the passed out students, Alumni and Stakeholders of respective Programmes. Under the Programme exit survey Likert Rating scale based questions were asked to the respondents. On the basis of responses collected from all the stakeholders, the Programme Outcome and Programme Specific Outcomes have to be calculated. A questionnaire of five predefined questions was prepared and responses from stakeholders were recorded in the context of Linkert Rating Scale (10 Scale).

5. Attainment Calculation of POs & PSOs: On the basis of responses from all the stakeholders to the response sheet, the attainment of PO and PSO has been calculated. Then, those Programme Outcomes have secured value 1 are considered as Low Programme attainment, those Programme Outcome have secured value 2 are considered as medium Course attainment, those Programme Outcome have secured value 3 are considered as High Course attainment.

The college has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for efficient conduct of teaching-learning and other activities including cultural activities, sports, gymnasium and yoga centre.

Infrastructure and Other facilities

The college is spaced in two buildings viz. building A (1799.014 sq.mt), Building E (1881.13 sq.mt), Annex (111.52), Annex (38.76) with facilities of playground (10640 sq.mt.), security cabin, washroom, electric earthing and generator panel, water tank, etc.

- The College has classrooms, well equipped labs, computing equipment, staff rooms, a seminar hall, a library, a reading room and ramps for the physically disabled. There are 16 well-equipped classrooms out of which 8 are ICT enabled.
- The college has 11 LCD projectors with 2 Smart Boards, Fiber Silver plan from 300 Mbps to 4500GB, Up to 25 Mbps beyond/Unlimited internet connectivity and internet access facility.
- At present there are 88 Computers, 1 Laptop, 5 Scanners, 2 Xerox machines and 6 Laser Printers.

Library:

The College has a spacious and well-ventilated library with a collection of 6217 reference books and textbooks, 16 Magazines and 09 newspapers. The library has a reading room with the capacity of 50 users. The library provides open-source software KOHA, User Tracking System and E-Resources with N-List, UTS and KOHA software and 6 computers with internet facility.

Laboratories:

The college has 11 well-equipped laboratories for conducting practical's effectively of all programmes.

Language lab is available for the Department of English.

Cultural Activities:

Students are always encouraged to participate in cultural activities. The cultural committee has been formulated to encourage students to participate in various inter-collegiate and university level competitions. Annual Social Gathering is organized every year which provides an opportunity for students to showcase their hidden talent in various cultural activities.

Sports:

The college has excellent facilities for sports and games. The Department of Physical Education and Sports has carried out various sports activities to develop physical and mental health of the students and relieve them from stress. The playground has 10640 sq.mt. Area along with the fitness zone. Students are provided with T.A. / D.A. to participate in sports competitions beyond college campus at various levels.

Indoor Games:

The college has excellent indoor game facilities like Carom, Badminton, Chess, Boxing and Table Tennis.

Outdoor Games:

The college also provides students outdoor facilities 200mtr. Running Track, Athletics, Cycling as well as grounds for Baseball, Football, Kabaddi, Kho-Kho, Volleyball, and Cricket. Students are provided with sports material required for various games. The college organises “Padmashree Karmaveer Kakasaheb Wagh Smruti Chashak ” Kabaddi tournament every year.

Gymnasium:

There are 8 fitness stations under Green Gym facility.

Yoga Centre:

International Yoga Day is organized every year under Yoga Centre of Department of Physical Education and Sports. Yoga practices are conducted for the students.

Barcode readers and software help to make daily transactions very fast and accurate. Online Public Access Catalogue system deals with the Catalogues and Search of the Books in the library based upon various criteria like: Accession Number, Title, Author, Subject and Publisher with the details and the status of the books in library.

A user can use <http://192.168.4.21.9000> link (OPAC) for searching titles using smart phones. They can see details of book issue, new arrival, books transaction history and overdue details etc.

There are 6 computers in library: OPAC-01, e-Library-04, and Library Administration Work -01 with Electricity Power backup Uninterruptible Power Supply and Wi-Fi available. A spacious reading hall in the library accommodates 50 students.

The college has spent Rs.35, 400/- for subscription of the following e-resources *INFLIBNET* for a year.

College Library is a subscribed member of N-LIST which provides access to e-resources to students, researchers and faculty. The N-list provides access to 6,000+ e-Journals and more than 1,99,500+ e-books under N-List and 6,00,000 e-books through NDL.

The library plays significant role in enhancing the quality of academic and research environment. It comprises collections of academic books (6,217), magazines (16), newspapers (9) to fulfil the need of teachers, researchers and students.

Per day foot falls and login data for online access in library by teachers and students is 5443 and average issue is $5443/291\text{day}=18.70\%$ during the last year.

Library Advisory Committee meets regularly and discusses the activities of the library automation, purchase of books, conducting book fairs etc. To ensure purchase and use of current titles, the library gets assistance from teachers. The faculty members provide the list of latest titles to be made available in the library.

The college has a well-developed mechanism to upgrade and develop infrastructure facilities based on Information Technology. Budget is prepared for annual maintenance of facilities. Technical staff is appointed to look after the maintenance of hardware and requirements for providing IT facilities continuously. There are 88 computer systems with internet connectivity and 1 Laptop. They are protected with Quick Heal antivirus Software. There are 11 LCD projectors, 5 high resolution scanners, 6 printers, 2 smart boards, a well-developed college website and various software in the college, the up gradation of all these facilities is carried out periodically.

Internet Up gradation: The College has updated the internet connection bandwidth Fiber silver plan with speed up to 300 Mbps with data limit of 4500 GB and beyond this 25 Mbps speed with unlimited data for one month. There is also campus Wi-Fi facility with 4 modems.

Smart board: The College has 8 ICT enabled Classroom of which 2 are equipped with Smart Board. They are used to enhance learning capabilities of the students.

LAN connectivity: All classrooms, laboratories and administrative offices are connected with LAN.

Computer Systems: There are 02 computer laboratories, an electronic laboratory, mathematics laboratory and a language lab having internet facility in the college. All the departments are provided with the required number of computers with internet connection. Up gradation of computers is carried out from time to time as per requirement such as changes in syllabi, introduction of new practical courses, introduction of new technology and student strength. Students and staff can avail of Wi-Fi connection for their laptops, tablets and smart phones, which can be accessed from anywhere in the campus. E- Library facility is provided for staff as well as for students.

Software: The College has Tally, E-Campus college administrative software, UTS-User Tracking System, Koha, N-list, Library Manager Software, Shree Lipi Software and Quick Heal Antivirus. The college uses ERP software which has different modules such as Online Admission, Time-Table, Teaching Plans, Attendance and display of events organized etc. The college has a biometric facility for staff and leave record is maintained on this basis.

CCTV Cameras: 15 CCTV cameras have been installed for surveillance at prominent places in the campus.

Use of ICT: The College uses online sources for updating knowledge of faculty members, students and administrative staff. Faculty members have YouTube channels on which they upload their lectures. They also use Zoom Platform, Google Meet for Online lectures.

6.4 Financial Management and Resource Mobilization

6.4.1

Institution has strategies for mobilization and optimal utilization of resources and funds from various sources (government/ nongovernment organizations) and it conducts financial audits regularly (internal and external)

Response:

Mobilization of Resources:

The college is self-finance and on permanently non-grant basis. Certain grants are received from Government and Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune for college development under relevant scheme for development of infrastructure and knowledge resource of college. Additional funds required by the college are provided by the Management.

Proper planning is done in the college for the mobilization of funds.

4. The grants are received for carrying out the stipulated regular activities and Special Camp under National Service Scheme.
5. The Red Ribbon Club of the college receives a grant from the Maharashtra State AIDS Control Society to organize HIV-AIDS Awareness and Blood Donation Camps.
6. The student development board of the college receives funds through the Board of Student Development of University to implement Earn and Learn Scheme and organize various

workshops.

7. Funds are available to the college for organizing various lecture series through the Board of Extra Mural Studies of University.
8. The financial support required for examination work is received from the University.
9. Additional funds required for conduct of any other activity are provided by K.K.Wagh Education Society.

Utilization of Funds and Resources:

Funds received from Government, University and other sources are properly utilized for the specific purpose. The following system is adopted by the college for the optimal utilization of resources.

1. The college invites requirements from all departments and accordingly prepares the budgetary plan.
2. College purchase committee prepares the requirement by considering the financial resources and needs of the departments submitted to the Principal. The college budget is then prepared and presented in CDC meeting for recommending it to the management for approval. Decisions regarding proper utilization of funds are made in consultation with CDC, Principal and coordinator.

Financial Audits:

Audit is mandatory for educational institution as per government norms and provisions in the Act and Statutes, hence the college conducts internal and external financial audit regularly.

Internal Audit:

The internal audit is conducted by Finance Manager of the K.K. Wagh Education Society on continuous basis if any issue regarding financial transaction suggestions is given by him from time to time, which are followed for preparation of financial statements.

Response:

As per NAAC guidelines the functional Internal Quality Assurance Cell should be established after accreditation or re-accreditation of the institution. Even though for smooth functioning of college administration and academic work, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell has been established by college before first cycle of accreditation on 11th December 2022. Before the establishment of IQAC the academic activities of the college were organized as per the recommendation of CDC. IQAC plays a vital role to achieve continuous quality improvement in academic and administrative activities of the college.

The basic task of the IQAC is to develop the system for conscious and consistent improvement in the overall performance of institutions. The IQAC develops mechanism for quality sustenance and quality enhancement. It plays an important role in designing/framing and implementing the policies for the academic development of the college. The role of IQAC is to motivate the faculty to participate in curriculum design and development. To promote the staff to use of ICT in teaching-learning process. To motivate the faculty to use innovative teaching methods and to collect feedback on all aspects from different stakeholders.

As per IQAC guidelines the Faculty In-charge conducts the meeting of all the teaching and non-teaching staff. In the beginning of the academic year, a department wise activity plan is prepared by each department as per the academic calendar of the college prepared by IQAC. To improve the quality of teaching learning, Faculty In-charge and Principal monitor whether the lectures and practical have been taken as per the teaching plan. IQAC prepares various feedback questionnaires. Every department collects the feedback from students. Each department analyses the feedback and discusses in the departmental meetings and submits a consolidated report to IQAC. IQAC prepares an inclusive feedback report of the college.

The student learning outcomes are reviewed through assignments, classroom seminars, and internal exam and university examinations. University results are analyzed at the end of each semester by the concerned department and sent to IQAC and CDC for further actions. If required suggestions are given by CDC members for further improvement and implementation.

The college has been consistently bringing incremental improvements in teaching, learning through student centric activities. A number of activities including Expert lecture, Certificate Courses, student presentation, field visits, study tours, internship have been arranged by the college.

Students should get acquainted with that game to develop a love for Kabaddi and contribute to the betterment of the country for Kabaddi competition. Hence, the college has decided to organize A *Karmveer Smruti Chashak Kabaddi* Competition with the support of K. K. Wagh Education Society.

4) The Practice

Karmveer Smruti Chashak Kabaddi Competition is organized at the district level every year in the college. The competition is open to all the teams of rural area in Nashik District for restricted talukas. From preparing the playground to organizing the competition is done in disciplined manner and proper planning. Under the banner of K.K.Wagh Education Society, college carries out the responsibility every year. For preparing better playground and avoid injury to sportsman red soil is brought from the outside to prepare the ground. Various committees are constituted under the chairmanship of Principal for successfully completion of the competition. The competition starts with inaugural function in the presence of well-known persons from the *Kabaddi* Association. Attractive prizes and trophies are given to the winning team at the end of the competitions.

Many colleges and other club teams participate in *Kabaddi* competition. The college makes arrangement for accommodation, changing room for boys and girls teams. T-shirts and breakfast is given to all players by the college with society logo. First-aid kit is made available in case of any injury or accident. Ambulance service is kept ready till the completion of the competition. College also appoints non-teaching staff and volunteers for serving of drinking water and other requirements for maintaining the ground.

The participation of colleges and teams in the competition has possible to make contacts and exchange information. The result of this tournament helps to prepare good players for India in the future. This competition helps to build healthy and capable society.

1. Problems encountered and resource required

College has started *Kabaddi* competition with the help of internal and external organizations. Funds for the competition are provided by parent institute and 'Smile & Spinach'.

Problems

1. The numbers of girls participating in the *Kabaddi* were less than boys. However, the number of girls participating in the sports is increasing.
2. There was not much interest in *Kabaddi* among students but due to the organization of competition the interest is increasing day by day.
3. There is shortage of red soil for the ground. Several difficulties in getting the red soil, such as the government rules regarding the transport of red soil.

Computer Science.

Our visionary leader Ex. President of K. K. Wagh Education Society Late Balasaheb Wagh alias Bhau started **Karmaveer Scholarship Scheme** for poor students who face the problems in paying the fees. Through this scheme, out of the fees fixed by the university, Rs.5,000 is credited to each student's account as scholarship and the remaining amount of fee is collected from the students. During the academic years 2018-2019 to 2022-2023 in all 392 needy students are benefited.

5) Evidence of Success

The educational institutes can bring social and economic change through higher education. The college is strongly committed towards the development of youth from rural & poor families of Niphad Tehsil. In view of this the college has introduced the B.Sc. Computer Science programme which provides excellent job opportunities for students.

In the beginning, all students did not take interest in admission for Computer Science due to Excess fees but later due to Karmaveer Scholarship Scheme gradually the numbers of students taking admission in Computer Science program are increased. 7.3.1

Portray the performance of the Institution in one area distinctive to its priority and thrust within 1000 words

Response:

K.K.Wagh Arts, Commerce, Science and Computer Science College located at Kakasaheb nagar (Ranwad) in Niphad Taluka of Nashik district. Due to huge expenditure on cultivating grapes and correspondingly low market price, every farmer is in debt. More than 90% students parents main business is agriculture. Most of the students are found economically backward conditions. Hence to protect the students from heavy medical expenses due to any decease, our college have decided to facilitate **Group Mediclaim Insurance Scheme** for all the students. Under this policy the students are prevented from the stress of the financial situation arising from health problems. The financial situation of students and their parents is desperate. The expenses incurred at such are not affordable for most of the families. To improve this situation and secure the future of the students and parents in terms of health, it was decided to implement the student group Mediclaim scheme.

The scheme is implemented through the assistance of two insurance companies, namely 'The New India Assurance Company and Tata AIG General Insurance Company Limited. Both the companies are reputed companies in insurance sector. The New India Assurance Co. Ltd. is an Indian public sector General insurance company having head office at Mumbai. It is the largest nationalized general insurance company of India on the basis of gross premium collection inclusive of foreign operations. It is a joint venture between the Tata Group and American International Group (AIG). Tata Group holds a 74 % stake in the insurance venture with AIG holding the balance of 26 %. Tata AIG General Insurance Company Limited (Tata AIG General) is a business collaboration of the Tata Group and American International Group, Inc. (AIG).The company provides corporate and personal insurance services and automotive insurance as well. The College has negotiations with 'The new India assurance company since 2018 to 2020 and with TATA Company since 2020 till the date. The insurance premium per students in the academic years 2018-2019,2019-2020,2020-2021,2021-2022 and 2022-2023 was 170/-, 170/-, 190/-, 225/- and 225/- respectively.

In the academic year 2018-19 total percentage of enrolment for the policy was 96.20%. It is increased year by year after realizing its importance. We are proud to say that the percentage of students taking Mediclaim in our college was 100% in the academic year 2022-23.

- The sum insured for each student is Rs. 50,000/- Existing diseases are included in the plan. It covers expenses for 30 days before admission to hospital and 60 days after discharge from hospital.
- If the student has to be hospitalized for 24 hours, the insurance company reimburses the cost of the treatment. Hospital room rent and nursing charges are paid as per the rules of the insurance company.
- As per the rules of the insurance company, the age limit for this insurance for school students is 3-25 years and the legal earning age of the student's parent is 25-80 years.
- If the earning parent of the student dies during the period in accident, then the student gets an amount up to Rs. 5,00,000/- and if the student dies during the policy accident, the earning parent gets an amount of Rs. 1,00,000/- as per the rules of the insurance company.

Areas of Priority and Thrust:-

- A Girl student of the college was met with an accident in academic year 2022-2023. Her parents got Rs. 50,000 from the insurance company for her treatment.
- Emergency health insurance or Mediclaim is considered to be a great support for all students due to increasing cost of medical treatment and volatile situation.
- This policy builds a good commitment between college and students. Students think that the college cares about them and their health.

Activities for Social Awareness:

The college organizes various activities for creating social awareness. The majority of students from rural communities. The activities conducted under NSS and SDO has thrust upon creating social awareness about Gender equity, constitutional rights and human values such as Voter awareness rally, *Swachh Bharat Abhiyan rally*, Blood donation camp, distribution of mask and food during Covid-19, Eco-friendly Ganesha workshop, *Kuposhan Mukh Gaon Prabhatpheri*, *Jal Yukt Shivar*, Lake refit / repairing. The college has also organises expert lectures from the health department of government to create awareness about Hb, HIV / AIDS and other health related issue.

The college has clean and green campus. A large number of trees have been planted in the college premises. The college building and premises are cleaned daily. The solid waste is used through **Vermicompost** in the campus and used as a fertilizer. The Dry and Wet dust bins are kept in college campus. The college conducts Green Audit to promote the environment management and conservation.

The college has organized **No Vehicle Day** to keep campus vehicle free and also organizes lectures on environment related issues.
